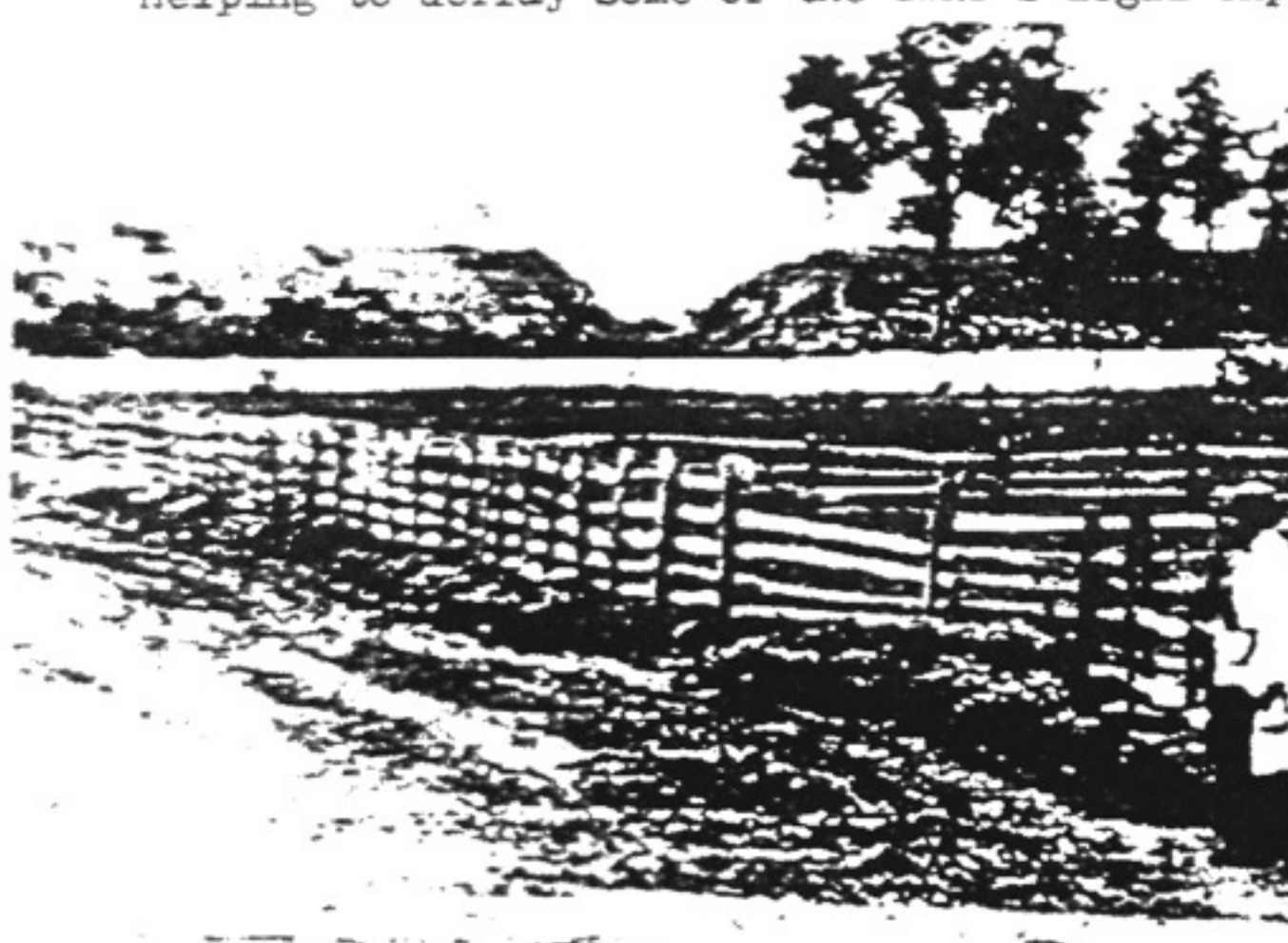
Topic: Gettysburg Battlefield  
Preservation: A History
